





Penfield Presents Master Swedish Storyteller

Penfield Books is proud to present three books by Judit Martin, an American native who's lived in Sweden for more than forty years and whose books present her adopted country in rich, telling detail with a born storyteller's insight.

Martin's novel, *Augusta's Daughter*, tells the story of Elsa-Carolina, capturing the day-to-day life of peasants in nineteenth century Sweden and the price a young girl pays for a forbidden love. Martin paints a vivid picture of the culture, customs, and superstitions of the time. The story is at times shocking but, in the end, celebrates the strength of the human spirit.

Swedish Portraits, a collection of five Martin short stories, also portrays the harshness of Swedish peasant life, along with the strength that allows most, but not all, to persevere. Included is *Alulf*, an unforgettable story that captures the loneliness of a Swedish immigrant to New York City and the fantasy life he creates to give his life meaning, with heart-breaking consequences.

The Bridge, another short story by Martin, tells the moving story of a family that operates a ferry between an island and the Norwegian mainland, only to have their lives unalterably changed with the building of a bridge.
